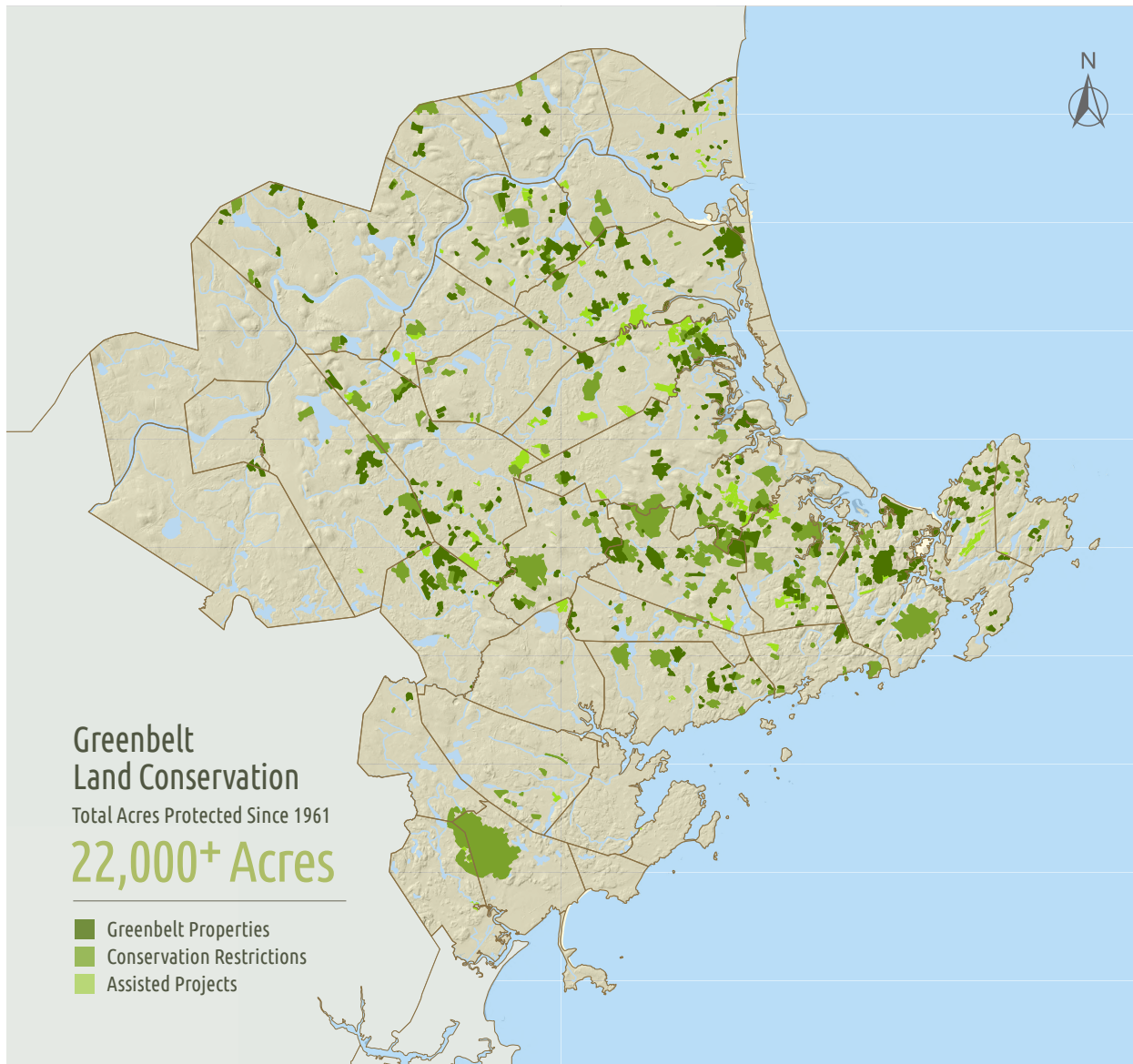

As you accrue hours, you are eligible for rewards

In addition to rewards, each department recognizes volunteers in their own special way. Appreciation events, unique hikes, and awards are a central part of recognizing all that you do for Greenbelt!

What to Expect as a Greenbelt Volunteer

First and foremost, we are so appreciative of your help!

So you can expect a warm and welcoming environment! Once you're on board, you'll receive a monthly volunteer e-newsletter that features volunteer opportunities, and a link to software where you can log in to schedule your volunteering and track your hours.

Here are some important guidelines:

- Please arrive on time for your scheduled shift. This will allow us time to set up and coordinate volunteers prior to the arrival of the public.
- Read our volunteer policy and sign your volunteer waiver when you create your log-in.
- Keep an eye on the weather and wear appropriate clothes (see checklist).
- Take proper steps to ensure your safety on the trail.
- If you are approached by the media, refer them to a Greenbelt staff member.
- Please cancel at least 72 hours in advance if you cannot make your volunteer commitment.

What to Wear

Identify yourself as a volunteer with your Greenbelt lanyard

Every Greenbelt volunteer is given a personalized lanyard, which we hope you will wear during your volunteer shift.

In the Office & Indoor Events

We ask that you dress comfortably yet appropriately for a casual office setting.



Outdoor Events & Programming

Recommended supplies

- Cell phone*
- Personal first aid kit
- Food and water
- Sunscreen
- Extra socks
- Insect repellent
- A rain jacket

Clothing Checklist

- Please wear any Greenbelt or volunteer attire you have received to distinguish you from the public
- Practical hiking attire – layers for the weather, long pants, and long sleeves if in the woods
- Practical footwear – hiking boots or other sturdy outdoor footwear
- Accessories – sunglasses and a hat

Optional

- Field guides
- Binoculars
- Camera

As needed for tasks

- Any necessary tools
- Work gloves

A Note about Safety and Insurance

Volunteer safety is our top priority

All volunteers are cautioned to use common sense and follow all prescribed safety procedures and operating instructions. Any accident, injury, or illness should be immediately reported to their supervisor.

Volunteer Conduct Policy

Conduct that aligns with the values and goals of the organization

Greenbelt expects that all volunteers uphold a standard of conduct that aligns with the values and goals of the organization. Volunteers' interactions with Greenbelt staff, the public, and other volunteers should be professional and respectful at all times. Volunteers are expected to follow all Greenbelt policies and reasonable instructions from staff members.

Inappropriate conduct, including but not limited to harassment, intimidation, bullying, discrimination, substance abuse, theft, dishonesty, threats, violence, sexual misconduct, insubordination, or any behavior that negatively impacts the organization or its mission, will not be tolerated. Any volunteer exhibiting such behavior may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination of their volunteer role.

We reserve the right to terminate or suspend a volunteer's participation in our program if their actions do not meet our expectations for conduct. The decision to terminate a volunteer will be made based on the nature and severity of the behavior in question and after consideration of all relevant factors.

Osprey Monitor

Document the behavior of Osprey in Essex County

Visit a nest at least once a week to record observations

Season: April - August. Volunteers submit an online data sheet once a week and can email photos as well. Volunteers work directly with the Osprey Program Director.

Volunteer Requirements

- Respect and uphold Greenbelt's mission
- Attend an orientation meeting
- Represent Greenbelt in a professional and positive manner
- Be reliable and responsible
- Recognize Osprey
- Be able to visit the nest for at least 15 minutes/week
- Have computer access to submit reports electronically
- Have a pair of binoculars or spotting scope

Hands-on stewardship projects

Support Greenbelt's field operations by completing hands-on stewardship projects. Attend stewardship workdays or tackle independent stewardship tasks focusing on trail maintenance and invasive species management.

Volunteer Requirements

- Respect and uphold Greenbelt's mission
- Attend an orientation meeting and training events during the season
- Represent Greenbelt in a professional and positive manner
- Be amenable to being outside in all seasons
- Interest or prior ability to identify native vs. invasive plants
- Able to complete physical work outdoors with a range of hand tools
- Able to carry load over 20lbs

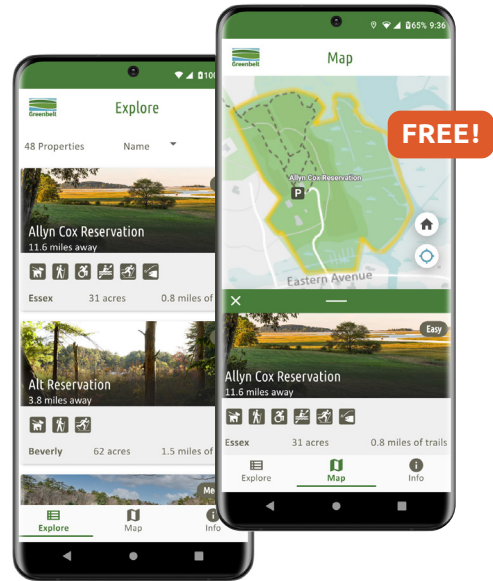
