



Hamilton Wenham Open Land Trust Selects Greenbelt to Carry Forward Land Protection and Stewardship

Recently, the leadership of Hamilton Wenham Open Land Trust (HWOLT) determined that they were no longer in a position to continue their operations, and chose to transfer their properties and remaining assets to Greenbelt to ensure the permanent protection and stewardship of the land entrusted to them. HWOLT was founded in 1985 by the late Dana Hansen, Peter Clark, Susanna Colloredo-Mansfeld and other conservation-minded Hamilton and Wenham residents.

Ken Whittaker, current President of HWOLT, comments, "Our team greatly admires Greenbelt for the excellent land stewardship work they do, and appreciates their support and cooperation in securing these important properties and conservation restrictions. It has been a great pleasure working with them, both in this matter and others in the past."

Greenbelt is honored to be the new owners and stewards of these important land parcels, including the 2.5-acre Dodge Farm that is the site of a thriving 50-plot community garden.

Greenbelt Ensures Permanent Land Protection, Monitoring more than 128 CRs in 2022

Greenbelt's Stewardship staff is well known for taking exceptional care of our properties and maintaining hundreds of miles of trails. Less known is the role they play in monitoring the Conservation Restrictions (CRs) Greenbelt holds on land across Essex County. In 2022, Dave Rimmer, Mike Carbone and Dave McKinnon were responsible for monitoring 128 CRs over more than 5,000 acres, some on land that is open to the public and some that is private. In 2023, the Stewardship team is scheduled to visit another 133 CRs on an additional 4,085 acres.
