Exciting New Conservation Projects:

Great Ledge & Bray Street, West

Gloucester

Greenbelt has the opportunity to purchase over 17 acres of land adjacent to Great Ledge and not far from the Tompson Street Reservation in West Gloucester. Please help us raise \$105,000 by January 13 to conserve this land and protect salt marsh, beaver ponds, and wooded uplands forever. Thank you!



Crystal Lake Watershed, Haverhill

Greenbelt is currently working to conserve 88 critical acres of the Crystal Lake Watershed. With your help, we will protect this land from the threat of development, preserve important wildlife species, extend the trails of the Crystal Gorge conservation area, and help protect the drinking water supply for the City of Haverhill.
